

A Message from Monsignor Connelly

Recently, I was in the Diocese of Worcester, our neighboring diocese, and visited Saint Mary's Church, Milford, MA. I had never been there before but was very familiar with it – Sister Margaret taught there in the parish school and shared many stories of her time there. The church is historic, large and imposing. As I was leaving the building, there was an impressive picture of the Sisters of Saint Joseph in the vestibule of the church, dated 1958. There were 29 sisters in that one school in those days! I took a moment to look at the names. In the front row, 66 years ago, was our own "Sister Dorothy James McNaughton", and it was noted, "later known as Sister Margaret". Monday, February 26, marks the two month anniversary of the death of Sister Margaret, and her influence in the Diocese of Springfield, the Diocese of Worcester, and far beyond remains.
