

Reflections on Veterans Day from our Rector:

On the 11th hour of the 11th day in the 11th month of the year 1918, an armistice was signed, ending the "war to end all wars." November 11 was set aside as Armistice Day in the United States to remember the sacrifices that men and women made during the war in order to ensure a lasting peace. In 1938 Congress voted Armistice Day as a legal holiday, but World War II began the following year. Armistice Day was still observed after the end of the Second World War. In 1953 townspeople in Emporia, Kansas called the holiday Veterans Day in gratitude to the veterans in their town. Soon after, Congress passed a bill renaming the national holiday to Veterans Day. Today, we remember those who have served for our country in the armed forces in our prayers.

As we celebrate *Veterans Day*, let us place our hope in the Lord, let us place our hope in tomorrow because America's road is not in the things of the world, but in the ideals that freedom and liberty affords us. The good news is that today, *Americans can still identify with our basic values of patriotism*, *life*, *liberty and the pursuit of happiness*.

Veterans Day gives the country an opportunity to thank those who have previously served in the U.S. military, and Memorial Day honors military members who died in service.

We salute all of the members of our Armed Forces, retired and active duty. We thank you for your service as we honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.
