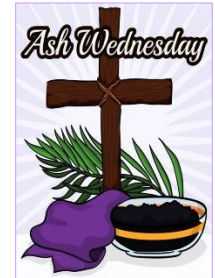
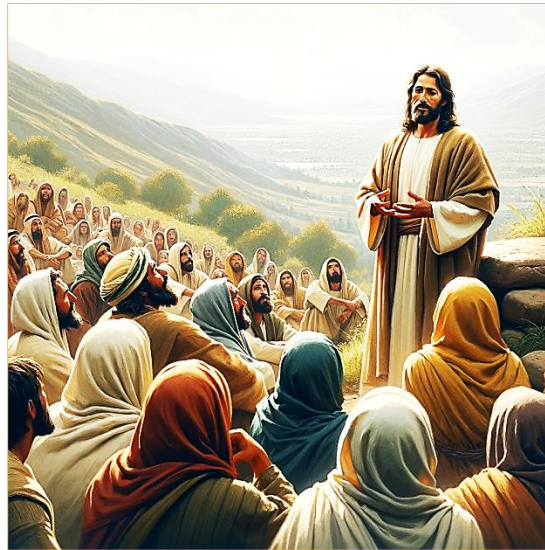

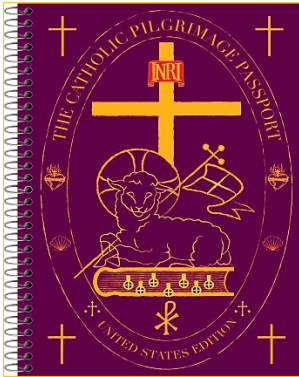
### **MISSION STATEMENT / MISIÓN**

In observance of the Jubilee Year, Bishop Byrne has decreed that *Our Mother of Perpetual Help Chapel at Thomas Aquinas College* will be an official pilgrimage site for the people of the diocese. As part of its celebration of the Jubilee Year, **Thomas Aquinas College** will host a special Jubilee Mass and accompanying devotions so as to afford pilgrims an opportunity to venerate Our Eucharistic Lord, receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and fulfill the requirements to receive a Plenary Indulgence at an officially declared pilgrimage site. The devotions will begin with Eucharistic Adoration, starting at 1:15 p.m., followed by Mass at 2:00 p.m., with the Sacrament of Confession available during that entire time.
