

## Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



**WEEKLY JUBILEE YEAR MASS AT CATHEDRAL:** With St. Michael's Cathedral being a designated Pilgrimage Site, we will be offering a weekly Mass using the Votive Mass for the Jubilee Year. We offer this Mass every Wednesday (with the exception of days that are Memorials or Feasts). This Jubilee Mass, when attended, can grant one a plenary indulgence, as long as all the prescriptions for indulgences are followed. To review those prescriptions we have made it available to read by the tabernacle in front of the Jubilee Cross.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS:** You may be seeing some work done in the Cathedral with regard to the Stations of the Cross. Bishop Byrne obtained a beautiful set of Stations of the Cross that were purchased for Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Holyoke. They were sitting there for many years untouched and in their crates. The Stations came originally from a closed church in the Archdiocese of Boston. Bishop Byrne asked that they be brought to the cathedral for use here. We hope that this project will be completed in time for Ash Wednesday, March 5th and the bishop will bless them as we enter into the Lenten season. Please bear with any inconveniences while this project is being executed.

**FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK:** On February 11 we celebrate the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes. It marks the first apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary in 1858 to St. Bernadette Soubirous. Between February 11 and July 16, 1858, the Blessed Mother appeared 18 times to a poor, uneducated, sickly 14-year-old Marie Bernade in the hollow of the rock at Lourdes, called "de Massabielle".

On March 25, the feast of the Immaculate Conception in 1858, she said to the little shepherdess: "I am the Immaculate Conception." Because the dogma of the Immaculate Conception had been officially proclaimed less than 4 years earlier, gave credibility to her apparitions and the confirmation from heaven that the dogma of the Immaculate Conception was indeed true.

During one of these apparitions, when Bernadette was told by Mary to begin digging in the ground; she obediently did so. Water immediately began flowing from the spot where Bernadette dug, a tiny stream that has since has grown to the size of a small river. Thousands of healings have been reported as the result of people bathing in or drinking this miraculous water. The walls of the grotto where the Blessed Mother appeared are lined with the crutches of the lame who have walked away from the waters, totally healed.

**What is the message of Lourdes?** First, we are called to look at the grace and holiness of Christ in Mary, become converted, and be healed spiritually. The second message was prayer. In order to be more fully conformed to the will of God, we must pray without ceasing. So, the message of Lourdes is a call to personal conversion, prayer, and charity.
