FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK:

St. Luke in today's Gospel depicts the baptism of the Lord by Jesus' cousin John the Baptist. Luke is telling us that through baptism, our sins will be washed away through Jesus' death and resurrection. It shows God's love for us and that, through the death and resurrection of Jesus, we are given the promise of eternal life.

Many people wonder: Why did Jesus need to be baptized because He is without sin. We are baptized to free us from the original sin we are born with. This allows us to have a new beginning in life. Jesus was baptized to show us His humanity at the beginning of His ministry. Baptism is a new beginning: we are freed of the original sin that resulted from Adam and Eve disobeying God. The Sacrament of Baptism starts our life out with God being a central part of our life and gives us the opportunity to live the life God wants for us. The Baptism of Jesus is God's way of allowing His son to start his ministry on earth. Through a dove, the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus which signifies God's approval for Jesus and what He will do for us. Remember the reason why God sent his only Son was because people were not listening and he wanted to save us from our sins.

Jesus' ministry asks us to emphasize repentance, renewal, and the calling to live a life dedicated to God's will. Jesus is on earth to help people to see and learn of God's love and to turn away from sin.
