MAY SHE REST IN PEACE:

It is with profound sadness that we announce the death of Fr. Sinh's mother - Maria Tran Thi Lanh. She was 77 years of age. She had a stroke just prior to Christmas and Fr. Sinh was scheduled to return to Vietnam on January 22nd. He had the opportunity to be with his mother for 5 days before she passed away on Monday, January 27th. Please pray for her soul and comfort and peace for Fr. Sinh and his family.

FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF JESUS:

This weekend, February 2nd we celebrate the Feast of the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, also known as Candlemas. 40 days after His birth, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the temple for the rites of purification and dedication as prescribed by the Torah. In the Book of Leviticus (12:1-4), when a woman bore a male child, she was considered "unclean" for 7 days. On the 8th, the boy was circumcised. The mother continued to stay at home for 33 days for her blood to be purified. After the 40 days, the mother and the father came to the temple for the rite of purification, which included the offering of a sacrifice — a lamb for a holocaust and a pigeon or turtledove for a sin offering, or for a poor couple who could not afford a lamb, two pigeons or two turtledoves. Joseph and Mary made the offering of the poor (Lk 2:24).

Also, Joseph and Mary were obliged by the Torah to "redeem" their firstborn son: "The Lord spoke to Moses and said, 'Consecrate to me every first-born that opens the womb among the Israelites, both of man and beast, for it belongs to me" (Ex 13:1). The price for such a redemption was five shekels, which the parents paid to the priest. This "redemption" was a kind of payment for the Passover sacrifice, by which the Jews had been freed from slavery.

St. Luke doesn't mention this redemption, but rather the presentation: "When the day came to purify them according to the law of Moses, the couple brought Him up to Jerusalem, so that He could be presented to the Lord, for it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every first-born male shall be consecrated to the Lord'" (Lk 2:22-23). So, the focus is on Jesus' consecration to God. The verb in Greek "to present" also means to "offer." Jesus is presented as the priest who will offer Himself as the perfect sacrifice to free us from the slavery of sin, seal the new and eternal covenant with His blood, and open the gates of heaven.

So, the Presentation is a proclamation of Christ — Messiah and Priest. He is the light who came into this world to dispel sin and darkness. For this reason, at least since the 7th century, candles have been blessed at Mass that will be used throughout the year, hence the term "Candlemas."

As we celebrate this feast, we remember that our parents presented us at church for our baptism. We were dedicated to God, and given the name, "Christian." We received a lit candle from the paschal candle, at which the priest said, "You have been enlightened by Christ. Walk always as a child of the light and keep the flame of faith alive in your heart..." So, as a light, each of us must bear witness to Our Lord. We must be the beacon that guides others to Christ.

In many Eastern European countries, the feast of the Presentation officially closes the Christmas season. For this reason, Pope St. John Paul II began the custom of keeping the Nativity scene in St. Peter's square until Feb. 2.
