MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR:

HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Yes, this weekend we celebrate a New Year - the Liturgical Year of the Church. We enter into Year C which will bring a whole new set of readings for us to ponder throughout the New Year. During Advent, we are called to focus on our relationship with God. We are called, in particular, to repent of sins and receive God's forgiveness. That way, we can be ready when Jesus comes. While Jesus is away (like the traveling man in the Gospel), what are we doing with what He has given us?

We bless and light the first candle of our Advent Wreath in our Cathedral church. *I encourage every family to have a small wreath in their home and light a candle each week to symbolize the growing light of Christ toward Christmas who illuminates our way in a world cast in darkness.* So... Happy New Year to you all and let's celebrate the joy of Advent which leads us to the coming of the Season of Light which is Christmas and the birth of Jesus, the Savior of the World.

COLLEGE AGED STUDENT MASS:

On Wednesday, December 4th we will have our Mass for College aged students at 7:00 p.m in the Cathedral. The Mass will be celebrated in the St. Augustine Crypt Chapel. Following the Mass we will gather the women for a Women's Night in the crypt area and the men will gather for a Men's Night in the Cathedral rectory. Saint of the Day - December 2 Blessed Rafal Chylinski

Born near Buk in the Poznan region of Poland, Melchior Chylinski showed early signs of religious devotion; family members nicknamed him "the little monk." After completing his studies at the Jesuit college in Poznan, Melchior joined the cavalry and was promoted to officer rank within three years. In 1715, against the urgings of his military comrades, Melchior joined the Conventual Franciscans in Krakow. Receiving the name Rafal, he was ordained two years later. After pastoral assignments in nine cities, he came to Lagiewniki, where he spent the last 13 years of his life, except for 20 months ministering to flood and epidemic victims in Warsaw. Rafal was known for his simple and candid sermons, for his generosity, as well as for his ministry in the confessional. People of all levels of society were drawn to the self-sacrificing way he lived out his religious profession and priestly ministry.
