From the Rector's Desk:

In our Gospel this weekend, Jesus is teaching about the notion of personal responsibility when it comes to sin. Instead of looking at sin as the reason that other people suffer calamities, we need to look instead to ourselves. Jesus says, not once but twice: "If you do not repent, you will perish as they did."

The lack of personal responsibility for sin seems to be symptomatic to our modern age. We are quick to point fingers at others when something goes wrong, instead of owning up to something if we are to blame. It's easier to blame society or government or childhood upbringing instead of shouldering the responsibility when it comes to personal sinfulness. That's what repentance is all about.

Thomas Merton, the Trappist mystic, spoke of repentance when he reflected on the Good Thief at the Cross of Jesus in his book, *No Man Is an Island* when he wrote: "The dying thief had, perhaps, disobeyed the will of God in many things: but in the most important event of his life, he listened and obeyed."

Personal responsibility for sin is difficult, no doubt about that, but Jesus advocates for us to the Father and gives us the grace to grow and bear fruit. But first, we must repent and take personal responsibility for our sinfulness. And if repentance is difficult, remember that God's grace is enough to help us seek forgiveness and grow in his love.


