FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

This weekend, with the 5th Sunday of Lent, we enter into what the Church calls Passiontide. During this time the Catholic community worldwide enters into a period of solemn reflection and renewal. This time, which begins on the Fifth Sunday of Lent and concludes with Holy Week, invites us to journey alongside Christ on his path to the Cross. It is a time to reflect deeply on the suffering and sacrifice of Jesus Christ and to contemplate the profound significance of his Passion and Death.

Passiontide serves as a poignant reminder of the immense love and mercy of our Lord, who willingly endured unimaginable suffering for the redemption of all humanity. During this sacred time, we are called to prayer, penance, and spiritual renewal and to emulate Christ's example of selflessness, humility, and sacrificial love in our own lives.

The Church invites us to enter into the mystery of Christ's suffering through various liturgical practices and devotions during Passiontide. The veiling of crosses and statues in churches symbolizes the solemnity of the season, inviting us to turn our gaze inward and ponder the depth of Christ's sacrifice. The readings make a dramatic turn to focusing the suffering of Jesus as he prepares to enter into his Passion, Death and Resurrection.

Passiontide offers a sacred opportunity to pause, reflect, and deepen our relationship with Christ amidst our busy lives. It is a time to recommit ourselves to living out the Gospel message, serving others with compassion and kindness, and embracing the call to holiness.

May the solemn observance of Passiontide lead us closer to the love and mercy of our Savior, who triumphed over sin and death for the salvation of all humanity. Let us enter this holy season with open hearts to grace, minds attuned to prayer, and spirits prepared for the joy of Easter.

24 HOURS OF MERCY:

The Cathedral Parish, in conjunction with this Jubilee Year will have 24 hours of mercy celebrated on Mercy Sunday weekend. From Friday, April 25th at 1pm (following the 12:10 Mass) we will have Eucharistic Adoration and confessions begin heard for 24 hours straight. Yes, right through the night. There can be no excuse to find time to come and receive this Sacrament of God's mercy and adore him in the Blessed Sacrament. There will be a board to sign up for a Holy Hour of Adoration during these 24 hours. Priests will be on hand during the entire 24-hour period to hear confessions. This is the opportunity, particularly during this Jubilee Year, to confess your sins and receive immense graces from making the effort to come and adore Our Lord, particularly during the Night Watch.

Please note: we will have police presence in the Cathedral parking lot so there will be no worry of danger on our Cathedral property.
