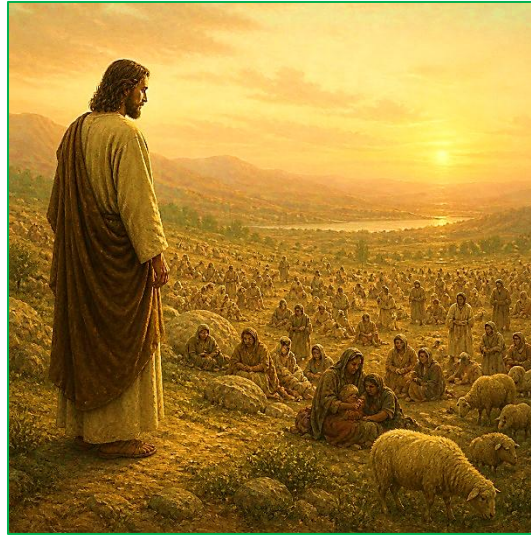

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK:

By the time you read this bulletin, the Bishops of the United States will have already consecrated the nation to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, in honor of the country's 250th birthday. The consecration will happen on June 11, the eve of the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart and the conclusion of the Bishops meeting taking place in Orlando, FL. The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is always a momentous occasion, but this year, in the United States, it has even more significance. On July 4, 1776, the Declaration of Independence was signed, and 2026 marks the 250th anniversary of the birth of our country. What better way to show our thanks to God and to ask for the continued protection and guidance of the United States than by officially dedicating the entire country to the most Sacred Heart of His Divine Son? Bishop Byrne will consecrate the Diocese of Springfield to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus this weekend at the 10am Mass. Ecuador leading the way in 1874, and now a little over two dozen nations have followed suit. But although the U.S. has been consecrated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary (our nation's patroness), it has yet to be officially consecrated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Archbishop Sample of Portland, Oregon, who chairs the USCCB Committee for Religious Liberty, told OSV News there are **three** essential reasons for the consecration. **First**, "would be to place our nation under the kingship of Christ. We are a democratic republic; we are a civil society – but no civil society can long endure without being under the kingship of Christ himself; to place ourselves under God's providence and care." **Second**, "there's a certain reparation aspect to the Sacred Heart. I think we can't forget that part of the consecration is to make reparation for offenses against God; against the heart of Christ." Some of those offenses, he remarked, are part of American history. "We are a great and blessed nation – but there are mistakes that we have made as a people over these 250 years. And so, this is a good time, to also make reparation to the heart of Christ for those offenses against his love, and his mercy, and his justice – for all peoples." **Third**, "to call us to have a greater heart for the poor and the suffering ... It has to move us, and move our hearts."

Here is the Consecration Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus: (will pray this prayer together at each of the Masses this weekend at the end of the Prayer of the Faithful)

O Most Sacred Heart of Jesus: You know the longings of our hearts, and you desire that we enjoy friendship with you.

From your pierced side, you have poured out the wellspring of life, for which we thirst. Your heart burns with a love for all people to return to a right relationship with you.

We celebrate the abundant gifts you have given this nation, founded on the self-evident truths that our Creator has endowed all people with the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

We make reparation for the offenses against you and against human dignity that have taken place in this nation. May our hearts be united to yours, so that our families and communities enjoy peace and happiness; may broken relationships be reconciled, injustices repaired, and the wounds of our land be healed. May your holy Catholic Church serve as a sign, pointing all people to your infinite love.

O Desire of Nations and Center of History, we ask you to bless these United States of America and in particular St. Michael the Angel Cathedral Parish.

Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.
